We don't just hold this ambition for the children who come to Sandy Lane, but for their families and the wider community too. We are just about to launch our FRED campaign (Families Reading Every Day), where all the children are encouraged to earn a FRED character, by reading every day with their families.

It is our ambition for reading to become second nature to our children and their families. We also want the wider community to benefit too. We are conscious that libraries are closing at alarming rate across our city and we want to be able to use our school facilities, outside of school hours for the good of the community and to promote reading for all. We have asked the Bradford Library Service to provide us with books that children, parents and the Sandy Lane community can access.

We aim to open our library for parents and children before and after school with regular slots for the local community too. We now have a fully stocked library and we are hoping to be operating a 'Library for All' in the next few weeks.

If so, come and volunteer to hear readers at Sandy Lane Primary School


- we promise you a warm welcome and an enjoyable experience at the same time.

In June 2018, Ofsted inspectors visited Bright Sparks Care Club to carry out their regular inspection of the setting. This was the first inspection to be carried out following the change of hands, when the former owner, Natalie Barlow, handed the reins over to Clare Rodgers in September 2016.

The inspection was a nerve-wracking experience for Clare, as this was her first as the owner and manager of the setting, along with the two members of staff, Jjeneen and Beth, who were also experiencing their first Ofsted visit.

After an afternoon of going through the paperwork and talking to staff, children and their parents, the inspector was very pleased with their efforts and the setting was rated 'Good' in all areas.

This is a fantastic outcome for the setting, which celebrated 19 years of being in business on 14th September 2018.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH DALECROFT RISE/LAMPARDS CLOSE/SANDY LANE AREA

In my last note to you back in June I wished you all a lovely summer and I must say we haven't been disappointed this year have we. I trust and hope that you have all been free from burglary or other crime which unfortunately continues whatever the weather!

I want to particularly mention to you this time the nuisance of telephone and e-mail scams. Two in particular have been going around this summer, one purporting to be from EE, the mobile phone provider and asking for payment of unpaid bills and the other from British Gas offering a refund on overpaid bills. There are and have been other similar scams pretending to be from well known companies. These scams look very genuine and have been organised to trick you but they are all designed with one thing in mind and that is to get you to give your personal and financial details. So the advice here is:

- * Never give anyone over the phone or in reply to an e-mail any private personal or financial details.
- * Never click on any e-mail link which you are not 100% certain about.
- * If you need to give any personal or financial details by phone or e-mail make sure the initiative comes from you, in other words the phone call or e-mail message is originated by you.

You can deal with nuisance telephone calls by installing a phone which blocks out such calls. One good one is the BT8500 or its latest derivative. This phone has an advanced call blocker and believe me it really works. When I check, usually weekly, on the incoming calls it really is surprising the number of nuisance calls that have been kicked out. So if you are thinking of replacing your phones I would recommend this one and I'm sure that other providers such as Virgin and Sky have a similar thing. With regard to e-mail messages, if you are in any doubt whatsoever just hit the delete button.

With regard to building developments in our area, other than a few bits of infill housing going on in Sandy Lane there has not been any movement on the major developments on the land between Dalecroft Rise and Chellow Dene or on the land between Florida Drive and Wilsden Road but keep your eyes open, particularly regarding the latter one, for any planning notices which may appear on lamp posts or telegraph poles. If you see any please let me know and we can take appropriate action

As we now approach autumn and the darker nights please keep your eyes and ears open, look out for your neighbours and in that way we can continue to be a happy neighbourhood.
