## Pupils Join Police and Partners For Day of Action

Children from a local school joined the Bradford West Neighbourhood Policing Team and partner agencies for a day of action in the wards of Clayton and Thornton.

The pupils from Sandy Lane Primary School assisted the officers with a Speedwatch operation. In separate operations the same day

(Friday, 16 November) officers seized a vehicle for no insurance and executed warrants at addresses in Clayton and the Lower Grange area.

The warrant in Lower Grange was carried out following intelligence from the local community and resulted in a cannabis farm being located. One person arrested in connection with the matter was later released under investigation.

Seventeen tickets were issued to motorists for not wearing seatbelts. One was reported for having no insurance and another driver was reported for a document offence. Sergeant Paul Riley, said:

"I would like to thank everyone for their assistance with the operation and I hope the children enjoyed their experience of working with their local officers." Councillor Sue Duffy added:

"Joining the day of action was an excellent way of seeing first hand this great initiative in operation. I was surprised to see how many drivers put theirs and their passengers' lives at risk by not wearing seat belts.

"The children at Sandy Lane Primary School thoroughly enjoyed working with the Police, teachers and parents to check the speed of vehicles while learning a lot about staying safe. I'd like to thank the officers for co-ordinating this action with various agencies including our council wardens."



## NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH DALECROFT RISE/LAMPARDS CLOSE AND SANDY LANE

It's the Christmas season again and at this time I bet that most of us will think back in some way or another to our childhoods. Do you recall laying in bed on Christmas Eve listening out for Santa on his sleigh flying through the sky and then by some miracle getting into the house to leave many wonderful presents and taking the mince pie which had been thoughtfully left out for him. What wonderful days when we never questioned the technical problems of flying through the sky without so much as a pair of wings or an engine. Nor did we question how he managed to get down the chimney especially when there was a fire at the bottom.

Those were the days of innocent childhood and beliefs.

As we get a bit older we begin to realise that Santa is not the only one who seeks to gain entry to our houses. Recent reports from the Police have shown quite an increase in the numbers of burglaries, attempted burglaries and thefts from cars in our area. Burglars are almost as inventive as Santa when it comes to getting into our houses. So whilst you might leave the chimney open for Santa please remember to keep all other means of entry securely closed and locked. Don't leave anything on view, particularly keys and wrapped up presents. Remember that one in four burglaries is made through insecure doors and windows and a high level of car theft is achieved by means of keys stolen from the house. Remember also that whilst wet and windy weather is not pleasant for most of us it is ideal for the burglar because it hides the sounds made in breaking into a house. It is advisable to leave lights on when you go out after dark so that a potential burglar will have second thoughts and make sure your car is locked and nothing left on view. Be really vigilant at this time of year and keep a look out for yourself and also for your neighbours.

We have not yet had any disruptive snow so far this year (late November) but it is a possibility before the winter is over. If you can, will you please remember to park your cars so that there is room for the gritter truck to get through. I think if we make it difficult for the gritters and snow ploughs to get through, Bradford Council may use it as an excuse to save money by not giving us the service.

There is nothing further to report about the proposed housing developments near to Chellow Dene and near to Florida Drive but keep your eyes open for planning notices which mysteriously appear on lamp posts etc and if you see any please let me know and then we can take appropriate action.

Having said all that it only remains for me to wish you all a very happy and restful Christmas.
