Monday of each month, at Bethel Baptist Church at 6.00pm. All meetings are open to the public, and we are very welcoming!



11.02am The Last Post



BEAVERS

- Our Beavers continue to thrive, with new joiners replacing many who have moved up to Cubs.
- We have 9 Beavers at present, with 4 Adult Leaders, and 2 Young Leaders.
- At the time of writing, we have a few spaces for any potential new Beaver.
- Programme included several camps, sleepovers, Eureka trip, Canal Water Adventure, climbing, archery.
- 127 Badges and 1 Bronze Chief Scout Award have been gained over the past 12 months.

CUBS

- Cubs are thriving, with 15 currently on the books, 3 Leaders and 3 Young Leaders.
- Programme has included cycle challenge in Dewsbury,
 Eureka Trip, Badge Days at Bradley woods, joint sleepover with Scouts, climbing, archery.
- 198 Activity Badges and 7 Chief Scout Silver Awards have been gained over the past 12 months.

SCOUTS

- We currently have 16 Scouts, with 3 Leaders and 1 Young Leader.
- Activities included Shooting & Archery Competition, plenty of camping (at least 1 per term), Expedition Challenge, sailing, climbing, cooking without recipes!
- 169 Activity Badges, 47 Challenge Awards and 4 Chief Scout Gold Awards have been gained over the past 12 months.

EXPLORERS

- We have recently had an explosion in the number of Explorers as our Scouts move up and we are attracting new Explorers to join the team. We currently have 21 Explorers, with 2 Leaders.
- Activities included several camps and sleepovers, pioneering, Monopoly Challenge, Canoe Duke of Edinburgh Expedition, climbing.
- 152 Activity Badges, 2 Duke of Edinburgh Bronze and 5 Chief Scout Platinum Awards have been gained over the past 12 months.

NETHERLANDS CAMP 2025



Our Scouts and Explorers had a small camp in the Netherlands this summer! It started 7 years ago, when Dave and Emily, our Scout Leaders, had a vague idea that it could be fun to take our Scouts on a camp in the Netherlands. Just as we were about to look at

it in detail, the pandemic hit and everything stopped. It took a few more years to sort out an initial shape.

We launched the camp to our members and families at the Group AGM in 2023. Since then, it has grown from a small idea to successful week in Europe. From these initial planning stages, the trip morphed into various forms as we all investigated the possible options for transport, accommodation and activities as the new rules for the EU became apparent. Coach transport, ferry from Dover and a campsite in Rotterdam were eventually all booked.

Total of 39 travelling:

- · 17 Scouts:
- 10 Explorer Scouts;
- 6 Leaders from Scouts, Explorers, Cubs and Beavers;
- · 4 parents and family members
- · 2 Support Team members in the Netherlands.

Plus our UK Support Team.

The programme was a mix of on-site activities and off-site visits.


On site activities included:

- Dutch culture, language and what we could expect to see when off-site.
- Dutch games including Yakkar turning.
- Teamwork challenge to look at decision making and reasoning.
- · Water activities with boating and rafting.
- Mix of traditional and new indoor and outdoor Scout games.

Off-site visits included:

- A day in Rotterdam up the Euromast, explored the cube houses and street food from the Markthal.
- A day in Delft town quiz, shopping (spending some pocket money!), Nieuwe Kerk, learning history of the city and climbing the tower to take in the landscape and views.
- Shopping at a local supermarket where the young people deciphered the options to buy themselves lunch.
- Trip to Madurodam to call it a model city would not do it justice.
- Trip to Scheveningen Beach (it rained!!) shallow paddle and sandcastle building competition, fries and traditional Dutch hot snacks on the pier.
